EVA BURROWS SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship:

- reflects the late General Eva Burrows' commitment and passion for advancing social justice, education and the development of leaders;
- supports the development and leadership of officers and soldiers of The Salvation Army in Africa;
- is open to both men and women;
- in any year provides financial support up to \$25,000 in total for:
 - a single recipient with up to 12 months approved study; *OR*
 - two recipients with a shorter period of study; and
- provides for:
 - study based at Catherine Booth College;
 - accommodation provided at Catherine Booth College; and
 - regular mentoring during the period of study.

Applicants must:

- receive the endorsement of designated leaders in the territory of origin;
- have demonstrated effective leadership and a commitment to ongoing development;
- be able to obtain the necessary travel documents from both their home country, Australia and any transit countries; and
- meet the English language and other entry requirements of the University of Divinity www.divinity.edu.au/study/international-student-resources/

Closing date for applications for 2018 scholarships is 15 September 2017.

Successful applicants are expected to begin study in February or July, depending on the studies selected.
