RESPECT

We will treat everyone equally no matter where they are from or who they are.



INFORM

We will make sure you have information about what to do if you feel unsafe.

We will give you information about your rights and responsibilities, and make sure you know how to access information about your physical, emotional and online safety.



LISTENING TO YOUR VOICE

We will make sure there are lots of ways for you to have a say and be involved.

We will seek your input into how we can make what we do safer for all children and young people.

We will listen, act and continually improve safety where you learn, play or pray at The Salvation Army.



HELP

We do not accept the abuse or harm of any child or young person by any person.

We will make sure you know how to tell us about any safety issues or harm that you experience or you see.

We will take seriously any concern you raise and we will act quickly to ensure your safety.



SAFETY

We have rules and guidelines that describe how we provide safe people, places and activities for you. Even people who are not involved in working with children and young people must know and follow these rules and guidelines.

All of our people must follow our Code of Conduct. We expect our people to follow this list of behaviours when they work with you.

The Salvation Army cares about you, and we want you to be safe whenever you are attending any program, event or service with us.

Whether you come to us to learn, play or pray – your safety and wellbeing is central to all we do.
