Read Genesis 13:1-18

What stood out to you?

Was there anything that confused or challenged you?

Why do you think Abram would return to the place where he built his first altar to the Lord? What does the altar represent or remind him of?

What do you think this travel reversal tells us about our own lives when we mess up or make bad choices?

Knowing that the promised land was in the other direction to where he chose to go, what does this say about Lot's faith?

Have you ever been given a choice and quickly chosen the best for yourself, leaving the worst for another?

In Genesis 13:14 God tells Abram to lift up his eyes and look out on the land. Lot looked within to make his choice, Abram looked up to God to make his choice.

When it comes to making choices, how comfortable are you with letting God make them for you?

What are some ways in which the way you live is motivated by your desire to look out for yourself rather than others?

Places are significant to God. Sometimes there are places of remembrance for failures and other places of remembrance for victories. Do you have any special places in your life where God has done some great things or places that serve as warnings of past failure?

How does this passage teach you to walk with God in faith and obedience? Ask him to help you do that this week
