



## Matthew 28:16-20

What encouraged you, challenged you or spoke to you most and why?

What are the "ALL's" we see in this passage, and what are the implications? What is the main command?

Do you view the Great Commission as a joy or as a burden? What is the motivation and attitude that we should have as Christians when living out this passage? How can you personally grow in seeing it as a joy?

What does it look like to be a disciple of Jesus? What does it look like to make disciples, according to the passage? What are the observable ways you are/can be making disciples in your life-- both with nonbelievers and with other people?

Why do you think Matthew tells us that when Jesus' eleven disciples saw him that some worshiped him and some doubted?

What difference does Jesus' statement concerning his authority have on the rest of what he says?

How overwhelming must it have been for the disciples to be one of the eleven persons commissioned and charged to "make disciples of all nations;" how challenging does it sound to you today?

How are you learning to obey everything Jesus commands? How are you sharing his teaching with others?

What things are you already doing that you could make more purposeful for making disciples? Who has God already put in your life that you could disciple, or mentor?

What difference does Jesus' promise in his final sentence make in your life: "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."
