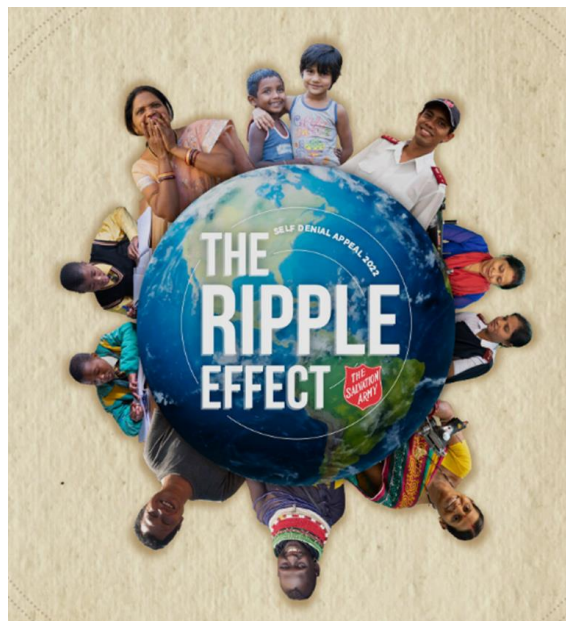

The Salvation Army is now active in more than 130 countries, and the Self Denial Appeal still operates in every territory. Whether living in wealth or poverty, Salvationists from all walks of life generously support the Army's mission to share the Gospel and improve the lives of millions of people through the love of Jesus.

The theme for the Self Denial Appeal 2022 is 'The Ripple Effect'. It reminds us that small actions taken in Christ's name can become big, life-transforming outcomes for the Kingdom of God.

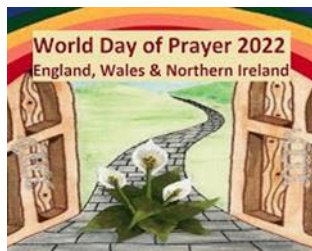
Community Development donations are tax-deductible and only support community development projects. Examples include projects for poverty alleviation, clean water and microfinance.
