'For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God.' Romans 8:14

Bible reading: Exodus 13:17,18

When Pharaoh let the people go, God did not lead them on the road through the Philistine country, though that was shorter. For God said, "If they face war, they might change their minds and return to Egypt." So God led the people around by the desert road toward the Red Sea. The Israelites went up out of Egypt ready for battle.

Only a couple of verses, but how much they can teach us!

Great miracles had happened in the land of Egypt. These miracles had only taken place to make Pharaoh willing to let the people of Israel go to the Promised land. All Israelites knew this. And after the tenth plague, there was no doubt anymore: at long last they were allowed to leave and go to the 'land flowing with milk and honey'.

There were no obstacles anymore for them to go 'on the road through the Philistine country'. God had set them free and they knew the way; what was to stop them? But God did not lead them on the road through the Philistine country...

What a miracle, what a blessing, that the Israelites allowed God to lead them! Just imagine that the promise God had given them - and their own knowledge - had been sufficient to them. Oh, they might have gotten there, but they would not have been so molded by all their trials that they would have shouted in obedience to God at the sound of the trumpet when they were at the walls of Jericho. They would – just as we are accustomed to - have deliberated on their course of action, they would have relied on their acquired knowledge and on the promises of God. But nothing would have happened at Jericho. Their self-confidence, after all the miracles in Egypt, would have stood in their way to put their trust in God and expect the deliverance from Him.

That is why God did not lead them directly to the Promised Land, but molded them through times of tribulation. Therefore, let us too not complain when the road along which God leads us is a bit longer than we find necessary.

The longest dark and the briefest day that marks the depths of winter and the turning of season towards warmer days. Heavy rains and storms blessed the land with a thorough soaking. Although we are far from the coastlines here, news of swollen tides reminds us of the breadth of these great migrations of cloud forms roaming the earth above us powerfully shaping our lives and the life of the land we depend upon.

Paying honouring attention to the seasons has been a wise spiritual practice from ancient times for many cultures. Praying for rain, honouring the sun's power are almost ubiquitous features of all religions thinly veiled under many different names. John's gospel for example plots all of the stories and teachings of Jesus around the traditional Jewish observances of the harvests; the early barley, the wheat and the last fruiting.

In the northern hemisphere Christian tradition has placed the celebration of Christmas and the coming of God incarnate in this deepest passage of cold dark wintering. God comes to us in our darkness with warm human flesh, breath and pulse and as Luke writes, by the tender mercy of God, the dawn from on high will break upon us.

So it was with this Christmas text from Luke 1 that we called one another to worship last week.

Though it is not Christmas season here now, next week is a local Australian celebration of NAIDOC week.

We have the chance to pay attention to our seasons and story here, close to home. Not just to understand country (land water skies seasons) better, but to sit humbly in the dark parts of our history and (again to quote Luke 1) to let the mercy of God's dawn "give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."

I'm living proof that even when all seems lost, salvation is real. Not just in the spiritual sense, but through the everyday acts of grace shown by people who are doing God's work here on Earth. Thank you, Jesus, for saving me. And thank you, Salvos, Hummera, and Ashir, for being His hands and feet when I needed it most. The salvos saved my kids and I and saved my sanity. Hummera and Ashir have helped my faith grow stronger. I appreciate them both so much.
