HOW GREAT THOU ART

Ps 145:2-3. Every day I will praise you and extol your name for ever and ever. Great is the Lord and most worthy of praise. His greatness no one can fathom.

Today's inspiring hymn of praise and adoration creation and redemption. Although written in the past reminds as of God's unlimited power and love in century, the hymn has become familiar to congregations just since the close of World War II. It especially became an international favorite after the Billy Graham Evangelistic Team used it in their crusades during the late 1940s and early 1950s.

The original text was written by a Swedish pastor **Carl Boberg**, in 1886. While visiting a beautiful country estate, Boberg was caught in a sudden thunder storm. The awesome and violent lightning and thunder quickly ended, leaving clear brilliant sunshine and the calm, sweet singing of the birds in the trees. Falling on his knees in awe and adoration of Almighty God the pastor wrote nine stanzas of praise. Swedish congregations began to sing his lines to one of their old folk tunes. The text was later translated into German and Russian and ultimately into English by the Rev.

Stuart K. Hine and his wife, English missionaries to the people of the Ukraine. When war broke out in 1939, it was necessary for the Hines to return to Britain, where Rev. Hine added the fourth stanza to this hymn. These four stanzas have since ministered and inspired God's people worldwide.

1: O Lord my God, when I in awesome wonder, Consider all the worlds thy hands have made; I see the stars, I hear the rolling thunder, Thy power throughout the universe displayed:

Then sings my soul, my Saviour God, to thee: How great thou art! How great thou art! Then sings my soul, my Saviour God, to thee: How great thou art! How great thou art!

2: When through the woods and forest glades I wander

And hear the birds sing sweetly in the trees, When I look down from lofty mountain grandeur, And hear the brook and feel the gentle breeze:

3: And when I think how God, his Son not sparing,

Sent him to die, I scarce can take it in; That on the cross, my burdens gladly bearing,

He bled and died to take away my sin:

4: When Christ shall come with shouts of acclamation,

To take me home, what joy will fill my heart! Then I will bow in humble adoration,

And there proclaim, my God, how great thou art!

In April, the world marked the passing of Pope Francis with sadness and reflection. His impact reached far beyond the Roman Catholic Church. The international leader of The Salvation Army, General Lyndon Buckingham, attended the Pope's funeral mass alongside many other Christian leaders in St Peter's Square.

Pope Francis' legacy of advocating for economic justice and the wellbeing of the poor, along with his example of humble service and inclusion, will continue to inspire Christians across the globe. A particularly impactful aspect is the Pope's encyclical 'Laudato Si', which conveyed the imperatives of environmental care from a Christian perspective, urging the Church towards a more considerate and sustainable future, safeguarding both the planet and its people out of our love for Christ.

Ecological impact

This call to care for Our Common Home reached across faith traditions, inspiring billions to reflect on their ecological impact and how we might collectively respond to the needs around us. As the global community observes World Environment Day 2025 (5 June), we are urged to unite in our shared humanity to protect and restore the environment. Governments, businesses, communities, and individuals can collaborate to become more sustainable and support the flourishing of all life.

Pope Francis shared this vision, stating, "As stewards of God's creation, we are called to make the earth a beautiful garden for the human family. When we destroy our forests, ravage our soil and pollute our seas, we betray that noble calling."

The Salvation Army's commitment is that "In its operations, among its people and through its public influence, The Salvation Army seeks to foster a culture of sustainability with a focus on long-term environmental solutions" (International Positional Statement on Caring for the Environment). This commitment is far-reaching and practical, encompassing our policies, purchases, practices, and education.

n Australia, this belief has led to the development of solar farms, community gardens and specialist recycling initiatives. All of this comes from a place of faith, believing that "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it" (Psalm 24, verse 1); a beautiful, wonderful, and endlessly fascinating place that should be treated with love, consideration, and care.

Behind the scenes, quietly in the background a miracle has been underway.

In our mission plans we are dreaming of adding a kitchen garden to our outdoor space, replacing what was lost some years ago in the works for the playground upgrade.

A community member from the Anglican Church who shares my great passion for composting has been coming in once a week over the past couple of months and chopping our refuse fruit and veggie scraps into small pieces for more speedy composting. After coming a few times she noticed the pile up of pallets from our deliveries and asked if she could take some to make veggie beds for us.

Quietly she's cut them up and reworked the wood, mindful of the good nourishment they will be holding and nurturing. This week she sent me a photo of her work in progress - this is her second construction with some improvements from mark #1.

There is so much of that aligns with the kingdom ways. Her deep joy will meet the deep need of others; this is truly a grass roots (or maybe soon better to say a rhubarb roots) initiative. We are embodying the love and honour for God's creation - visibly on site with the recycling of materials. Soon the beds will be complete and one chamber of our compost barrel is full and nearly ready for digging in to a load of soil.

This is how the kingdom grows - when we respond to needs and the prompts of the Spirit and give ourselves in ways that multiply our joy and the joy of others. This week the global church celebrates Pentecost, the pouring out of God's Spirit on ordinary people of all ages and diversities upturning expectations and stretching our boundaries of the possible.

This is not a destructive chaos but a wondrous unrestrained complexity of blessing. An empowering redistribution of the Spirit beyond all borders. Fire is a traditional symbol for Pentecost- not a tame safe symbol but a creative energetic power. As winter sets in, Let's draw together around the fire and be ready for the spirit surprises.
