

Central Vic Salvos

Living in Carisbrook and working for Central Vic Salvos across Maryborough, Castlemaine and Bendigo, the Pyrenees Highway has become very familiar. I watch the changes through the seasons across fields, farms and forests; driving into the sunrise in the morning and the sunset at night, dashing across in the middle of the day to make meetings under a high blazing sun or scooting home late at night with stars and planets overhead, there is always something to take my attention and make me wonder at the goodness and sadness of God's cosmos.

Crossing Cairn Curran Reservoir at Joyce's Creek, I've been observing the progress of our Summer-Dry hijacking the water; in great gulps the land and the air seem to be swallowing up all of the water. What was a wideand deep reservoir made by human damning, has returned again to the original creek between wide green pastures. A few small scattered ponds remain and there are occasional dead fish rotting in the newly sprouting weeds everywhere.

On Monday Gordon and I explored this area – and we found one lone fish in a small pond with barely enough water to stay submerged. Gordon, a compulsively compassionate pastor, set about saving this one fish. As he moved closer and closer to the pond, the mud became softer and squishier and he sank deeper – to his knees, and deeper -to his thighs – and deeper to his hips. He lent in and caught the fish gently in a wet tea towel and squelched back through the mud to the bank, crossed the verge to where the creek still runs and, entering the water to his waist, set the fish free.

I watched all of this – ready to try and rescue! But at the same time I was reminded of the beautiful writings of Ezekiel the prophet in the Old Testament. Ezekiel chapter 47 describes a vision in which he is taken to the Temple of God where a river flows out – and he is invited to step into the river – and in he goes – ankle deep, knee deep, waist deep then in over his head! And this river has fish of everykind, fresh and flourishing filling nets abundantly for food.

Our challenge in our faith is to wade in deeper and deeper – to take the risk of being overwhelmed by God's spirit, to risk getting out of our depth and depending on God, to risk the sinking squelching mud – to go in deep and reach out to rescue one who is only just hanging on to life.

- People making decisions to follow Jesus!


PLEASE PRAY FOR:














THIS SUNDAY






Beautiful birds creatively made in church last Sunday and still flying through Doorways during the week. "Not one of them is forgotten in God's sight" Luke 12:6




