A FATHER'S LOVE BEYOND COMPARE

Father's Day is a time to pause, reflect, and give thanks for the men in our lives who have loved, guided, and nurtured us. For some, it is a day filled with warm memories of fathers who were present, caring, and strong. For others, it may be a bittersweet day, marked by absence, loss, or difficult relationships. Yet in every circumstance, Father's Day invites us to look to the one Father whose love is perfect and unchanging, our Father in Heaven.

In the Lord's Prayer, Jesus taught us to begin with the words: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name" (Matthew 6:9). With this opening line, Jesus reminded us that God is not distant or unreachable. Instead, He is our Father personal, loving, and attentive to the needs of His children. Unlike earthly fathers who may stumble or fail, God the Father is constant in His care, patient in His discipline, and abundant in His mercy.

The Bible is filled with powerful images of God's fatherly heart. Psalm 103:13 tells us, "As a father has compassion on his children, so the Lord has compassion on those who fear him." Here we are reminded that the tenderness of a loving father is only a reflection of the deeper compassion God has for His children. His love is not based on our performance, but on His nature. He is slow to anger, rich in love, and steadfast in His promises.

On Father's Day, we celebrate not only the fathers and father figures in our families and communities, but also the character of God the Father, who sets the ultimate example of fatherhood. He provides for us, protects us, guides us, and disciplines us in love so that we may grow into the people He created us to be.

For those who may feel the ache of missing or broken relationships on this day, the message of God's fatherhood is especially powerful. Psalm 68:5 proclaims that God is "a father to the fatherless, a defender of widows." In Him, no one is overlooked, and no one is abandoned. His love fills the gaps left by human frailty.

As members of The Salvation Army, we are called to reflect the heart of our Heavenly Father in our communities. We do this by offering care, compassion, and support to those in need. Just as God embraces us with unconditional love, we are invited to extend that love to others—becoming spiritual mothers and fathers to those who long to experience belonging and acceptance.

This Father's Day, as you celebrate or remember, take time to lift your heart in gratitude to God the Father. He is the source of all love, the example of all goodness, and the Father who never leaves nor forsakes us. May His love inspire us to honor the fathers in our lives and, above all, to live as His children, bringing glory to His name.





Castlemaine

I'm pausing to acknowledge the great gift that it has been to have Paul and Bev Beeson as colleagues over the past 6 weeks.

An interim ministry role can be approached in different ways, and thinking about leadership in the context of temporary seasons helps all of us consider our contributions.

Our culture celebrates longevity, inducting people into a hall of fame or life time achievement awards.

And it is well established that sustained fruitful growth in churches correlates to leaders who have committed to a long term in one place.

However this norm can create the impression that to make a difference you have to become a permanent fixture.

But God is not limited to longevity and knows how to bring good things in all measures of seasons.

We have seen the blessing impact of Bev and Paul's short intentional season here.

As we came crawling out of Covid I pastored 4 different churches - two in the eastern suburbs of Melbourne, in Hobart and in Eaglehawk for varying lengths of time - 3 months, 4 months, 9 months, a year - but each one an intentional interim while waiting for their permanent minister to arrive. What could a church do missionally in three months?

In each place when I arrived we said 'God is not limited by waiting for a ministry appointment- or by how long you or I are here -so let's ask what the Spirit has for us to do right now, and then at least start doing it!

This is what Paul advised the early churches to do - they were expecting Jesus to return any minute - but he said 'don't let the waiting make you inactive - Now is the time!'

Some of what was planted was a quick shot in the arm of joy - a pop up singing group that did a couple of gigs outside our op shop justice songs. Other initiatives are still thriving years after I left - a spin off congregation that gathers around expressing God's call to celebrate and care for creation, called 'Something in Common'.

I know that parachuting in for a short time as the Beesons have comes with its own labour tax on the body, heart and mind, abd we honour them for their servant hood in that gift to us.

For those of us here for the long haul, if we feel we are getting stuck can 'borrow' this idea. What if we were only here for three months waiting for another person to arrive? What if Jesus return was next Thursday?

All the more reason to be plucky and adventurous in the gospel. Now is always a great time for sharing good news, for addressing what's wrong, for repenting, for stepping forward in faith.

Thankyou to Paul and Bev for their great example and gift among us.

When you return in November we hope you'll find much more flourishing here already.





