#### INSIDE OUT REVERSE COLOURING

This term at Kids club in Maryborough, we are mixing themes from the Disney animation Ínside Out' and stories from the life of Jesus. These sources engage us in thinking about how emotions work. We'll look into the stories of Jesus and ask first of all "How does Jesus feel?" and then, "What does Jesus do?" As followers of Jesus, we want to follow his pattern for handling our emotions. So this is an important part of children's faith development as they learn to firstly recognize their own emotions

and then choose what to do.

Here is some of the art from our first week:

This art process is called 'Reverse colouring pages'. In standard colouring books, a black line image is provided, and the colour is added within the lines of the image. Full disclosure: I detest colouring pages – along with many of educators and child-advocates and wellbeing agents.

In Reverse Colouring, the colourful page is given and the artist adds their own black lines interpreting the colours with whatever shapes or narrative images they choose.



The imagination is ignited by the coloured patches – there are so many possibilities. You can see how various artists from Kids Club have created strikingly different images from the same set of blotchy hues.

I especially value this art making process for the alignment it has with how we interact with our emotions. We are rational and emotional, instinctive and reflective beings with a complex brain but it's our feelings that most often arise first, which we then find meaning for, drawing a reasoning story of interpretation over how we feel.

Across my decades of study, research, writing and thinking about intergenerational faith formation I've seen that the most significant thing a church can do to nurture and strengthen the faith of its children is for the grown-ups to take care of their own 'emotional hygiene', setting the example for children to follow. We need to spend time looking at the colours on our page, reviewing the impact that grief, loss, trauma, criticism and suffering of all kinds have had on us, and become sensitive to the way we have drawn our story over the top; how do we see ourselves, and what do we do when we feel difficult emotions? Do we jump to defenses, to angry attacks, to fawning and over-people-pleasing, to blaming and shaming others? In my years in Christian communities, I've seen plenty more poor behaviour by adults than by children.

So this wall of art is a celebration of the emotional flourishing of our children, and a call to us as adults, parents, leaders, fellow travelers with children to do some serious spiritual reverse colouring.


