

In line with the Division-wide call to prayer, during the week beginning June 1 CVS Corps will be holding local prayer meetings to pray for our division and the 'Recasting the Net' principles and developments.

Continuing our tour through the many resurrection stories in the gospels this week we are landing in Matthew 28 – the passage that is often subtitled 'The Great Commission'. Matthew ends literally on a high point – a mountain, with alusions to Moses and the giving of the ten commandments, Jesus gives a new imperative:

NEW TESTAMENT

'as you go, wherever you go, take the goodnews you've learned from me with you'.

And then he lands on this final reasurance:

"And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."



On our last Sunday at church, the kind Sunday school teachers gave me a present – a very small bible, King James version, bound in pale pink leather with gold edging on the wafer thin pages. In the front they wrote this same verse.

This was milestone faith moment for me, as they read it to me: suddenly it was deeper within me. I had come to know and love God in the roaring of the waves by the cliffs and the cheeky toads in the muddy vegie patch, in the canopy of stars in the cold night sky over our backyard dunny, and the cheerful company of the crazy chooks, in the warmth of our wood stove and the bluestone of the church – but now I was told God wasn't stuck here: God would be wherever I was.

Since that first move, I've lived in 19 different places – and I'm about to check in to #20 here in Castlemaine. Glad to be here, and confident with faith God's spirit gives me still that we can live out Jesus'

words together:
