



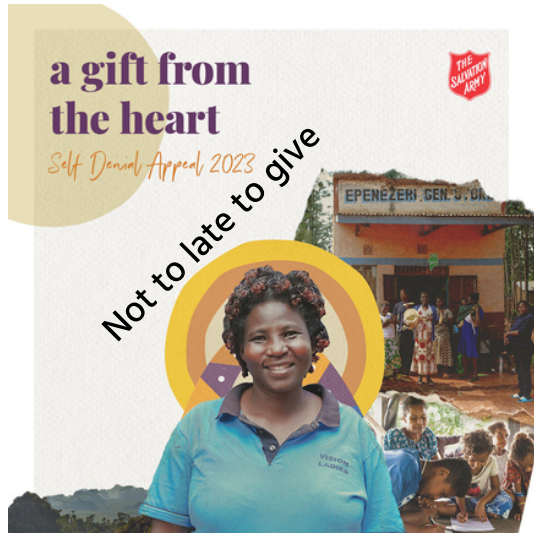
Central Vic Salvos

"He has Risen – He has risen indeed." (Referring to Jesus Christ has risen from death.) I heard some on the TV say that this week in the original Latin. At least I think that it was Latin – anyhow it sounded good. This Sunday we pull out this quote, dust it off, use it and then put it away for next year. I'm not sure how this phrase affects you but for me it is very powerful – just thinking about – 'He has risen indeed.' Brings to my thoughts and being an amount of confidence that has yet to be matched by what this world offers. However, I wonder if this phrase is used on a weekly basis will it become a set of words that diminishes over time because of being overused.

Isaiah is a book of the Bible that speaks much of the one that will bring us back to God our creator. These writings and in other parts of the Old Testament provide us with many encouraging words of hope that God will provide humanity with a redeemer. Someone that will bridge the gap created between God and His creation in the garden of Eden with the first act of defiance. Of course, a problem with prophesy is that there is no specific date and time.

Then comes John the Baptist saying that he is preparing the way for the redeemer. Then Jesus declares when reading from the book of Isaiah 61 that this prediction is fulfilled. The life of Jesus continues to fulfill many of the prophecies of the Old Testament providing evidence that this Jesus is 'The son of God,' and is 'The Redeemer.' With the resurrection of Jesus is the final step in God's plan to provide that bridge between Himself and His creation. Jesus was seen by many and the recordings of these sightings and experiences provide that reassurance that; "He has Risen – He has risen indeed."

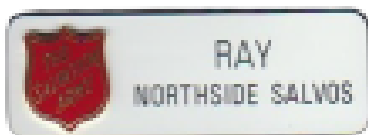

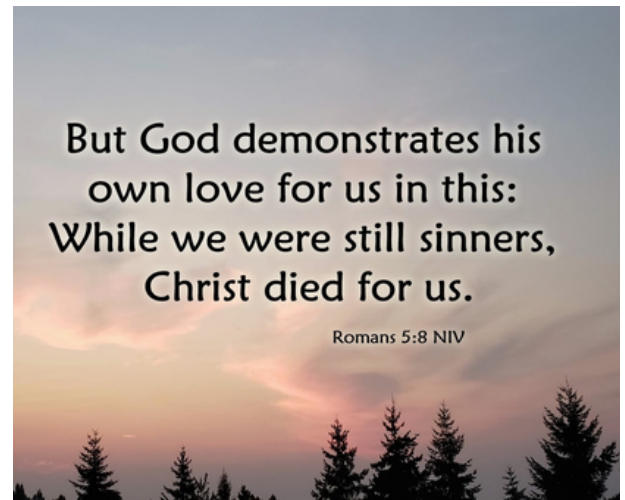
