

# Central Vic Salvos

## 25th February 2024

Matthew 6:21–23 is a profound passage from the Bible, found in the Gospel of Matthew, where Jesus imparts invaluable teachings about the nature of the human heart and the significance of one's focus and priorities in life. This passage is part of the Sermon on the Mount, a collection of Jesus' teachings that address various aspects of human conduct and spirituality.

The verse begins with the powerful statement, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21, NIV). This declaration encapsulates a fundamental truth about human nature—that our hearts and affections are closely tied to what we value and prioritize. Jesus is encouraging his followers to evaluate where they invest their time, energy, and resources because these choices ultimately shape the condition of their hearts.

In a materialistic world, where accumulating wealth and possessions often takes precedence, Jesus challenges believers to reevaluate their priorities. He implies that if one's primary focus is on amassing earthly treasures, their heart will be entangled in the transient and temporary. Instead, he urges them to seek treasures in heaven, which are lasting and incorruptible. This shift in perspective suggests a spiritual wealth that transcends the material, emphasizing virtues such as love, compassion, and generosity.

The subsequent verses, Matthew 6:22–23, delve deeper into the analogy of the eye as the lamp of the body. Jesus asserts that if one's eye is healthy or single, the whole body will be filled with light. On the contrary, if the eye is unhealthy or divided, the body will be filled with darkness. This metaphorical language speaks to the clarity of one's spiritual vision and the singularity of purpose.

The eye symbolizes the way individuals perceive and interpret the world around them. A healthy eye signifies a clear and focused perspective, emphasizing the importance of spiritual insight and understanding. Conversely, an unhealthy or divided eye reflects a distorted worldview, clouded by distractions and conflicting priorities.

In essence, these verses highlight the interconnectedness of one's inner disposition and external actions. They prompt individuals to consider the alignment of their values, intentions, and actions with spiritual principles. By urging followers to prioritize heavenly treasures and maintain a single-minded focus on God's kingdom, Jesus encourages a holistic approach to life—one that nurtures a virtuous heart and radiates spiritual light to the world.

## **SPLASH NIGHT**


