As we come together to CELEBRATE Our Lord and Saviour Jesus this Palm Sunday, may it be as momentous an occasion of JOY and THANKSGIVING, WORSHIP and ADORATION as it was that first Palm Sunday, but may we also understand the need to 'Humble Ourselves' - which is a condition of the heart and mind, and recognizing our utter dependence on God. To 'pray' - see James 5:16, we're saying 'I can't do it - but YOU can.' To 'seek God's face' - we desire a closer relationship with God, we want to know Him, spend time with Him, simply for who He is, and not for what we think we can get from Him. No selfish reasons. And to 'turn from our wicked ways' - we all need to constantly look at what we do and what we don't do, to be on the alert for apathy, unbelief, prayerlessness, lukewarmness, self-seeking, materialism, indifference, pride, lack of love, disunity, worldliness, idolatry, lust , which comes in many forms, etc. , etc.

It starts with each of us individually - 'If MY PEOPLE.....'

Meet at QEO Carpark at 6.30pm.


