SHARING YOUR STORY IN 8 SIMPLE STEPS

In what year did William and Catherine Booth found The Salvation Army?

1865. After his marriage to Catherine Mumford in 1855, William Booth spent several years as a Methodist minister, travelling all around the country, preaching and sharing God's word to all who would listen. Yet the couple felt that God wanted more, that they should be doing more to reach ordinary people. They moved to London and on 2 July 1865, William commenced his first open-air evangelistic campaign at the old Quaker burial ground in Whitechapel, preaching in a tent. The second of July is recognised as the birthday of The Salvation Army, known as 'Founder's Day'.
