Week 1 Our Radically Generous God



Key Verse: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord." Isaiah 55:8

Before the class begins

Pray that God would open your eyes in a fresh way to the two major truths of this lessons: 1 - That God's ways are not our ways and 2 - That generosity is the way of God. As you get ready to lead the youth in this way, you are potentially shaping their thinking in a way that will alter the course of their lives. So, pray for a deep connection with both the material and the youth that you will be leading.

I. Introduction (15 minutes)

- **Discussion Question:** Have you ever been to a culture somewhere in the world that's different than ours? For example, have you gone to another country where they ate strange foods or did things differently than we do in the U.S.?
 - Break the ice: You can poke fun at a neighboring town as a "foreign culture" if there is a rival high school there, etc.
 - Read, "8 Jaw Dropping Traditions from Other Cultures"
 - Say, "When you are in other cultures, you have to adapt to their customs. But, as Christians, the Bible says that we should not be satisfied with the culture of the world around us. In fact, it indicates that we are part of a culture apart from the culture of the United States. We are part of God's unique culture called the kingdom of God. And God's culture often looks completely different from our culture."
 - Isaiah 55:8 says, "'For my thoughts are not your thoughts. Neither are my ways your ways,' declares the Lord."

II. Discussion (35 minutes)

 Discussion Question: What are some examples that show that God's ways are different than our ways and His thoughts are different than our thoughts?

- Say, "Over the next 4 weeks, we are going to look at one specific way that God's ways
 are counter-cultural. We are going to see that at least in this one specific manner His
 ways do not align with the ways of America's culture."
- Discussion Question: In our culture, people like to get and accumulate things. We like to accumulate money so that we can buy all of the "toys" that we want to buy. If money wasn't an issue, and you could get anything you wanted, what would you get?
 - Say, "It's normal for us to desire to get nice things. That's part of our culture. But, did you know that instead of seeking to get nice things, God is continually working to give nice things? God's culture is not a culture of getting and hoarding, but instead it's a culture of giving and serving. It's counter-cultural for us, but it is the right way to live according to God."
- An Example from Scripture Feeding of the 5000
- Read Mark 6:30-44
- o **Discussion Question:** Where did you see the generosity of God in these verses?
 - Possible answers: He was sensitive to the disciples needs and encouraged them to get rest (v. 31); He had compassion for them and gave them understanding through His teachings (v. 34); He provided food for the multitudes (v.41); He gave more than they needed (v. 43).
 - Bring the discussion back to the big idea that God is the first and most generous giver.
- Discussion Question: What other points in Scripture can you think of that demonstrate God's generosity toward people?
- Discussion Question: Do you think it is possible to be a disciple of Jesus (someone who learns from His teachings and follows His ways) and NOT live generously?

III. Action (10 Minutes)

- God Gives
 - Distribute the "God Gives" handout
 - Give the youth a minute to look through the 4-page handout
 - Share one or two of the statements that have significant meaning for you and ask for one or two volunteers to share the statements of God's generosity that initially strike them as they look through the list.
- Say, "This week, pray that God help you to see exactly how generous He is. Pray that He would help you to imitate His ways as you interact with your friends and family. This week, pray that God would help you to be counter-culturally generous."
- Close the group with a time of prayer that focuses on celebrating the generous nature of God.
