426 UPDATE

For those of you who didn't hear Dot and Marty's announcements on Sunday 3 June, the fences have gone up at 34 Smith Street for demolition to begin. Also, our own preparations for 426 Church Street continue. The paperwork is just about all ready for us to go to tender, with the aim of starting construction at the end of August.

All the upstairs tenants have now moved out so we will begin to strip out and demolish the first floor of 426 in the next few weeks. This will speed up the build process and allow the builders to see exactly what they are dealing with.

The Project Control Group (PCG) of Richard Eden, Margaret Robinson, Sharon and me, along with the architects, project manager and DHQ reps (our own Barry Fischle) have been meeting fortnightly. Building sub committees continue to work on various aspects of the project, in particular the design team who are making decision on finishes and furnishings, and the AV team who are making decisions about sound systems, sound desks, projection, and AV in meeting and seminar rooms etc.

As part of the funding for the build we are selling the corps' second quarters at Pye Avenue Northmead. We've been working with a local agent to get the property ready for the market and it will go on sale this week.

However, it does feel like we are in a bit of a holding pattern while we wait for work to start. So what can we do right now? Well we can pray. Specifically, pray that 1) we continue to make good decisions that help us create an amazing mission enabling building 2) that the right builder tenders for, and is selected, to build our new facility 3) pray that the tender comes in around, or under, the \$5.6 million that has been approved for the project by the Territory 4) pray that we get a great sale price for Pye Avenue 5) pray that our ministry now as a multi site, multi congregational corps, continues to flourish.

We are grateful to God that we can use the Granville buildings in this interim period and I thank you for doing such a great job of adjusting to a very different space. It'll all be worth it when we move into our new building next year.

Please feel free to speak to any of the PCG if you have some more questions, we'll do our best to answer them.

INTERVIEW WITH AN APOSTLE

What interested you about the 'International Mission Event' that encouraged you to be part of it?

To be honest, I really didn't think I'd be a likely candidate for an International Mission Trip these days. I was challenged to think about it though - and the more I did, the more motivated I felt about the idea. South America is a destination that I've never experienced - and, at this point, never expected to. There are people in Ecuador that will enrich my life experience and with whom I can share a kingdom connection - that's exciting!

How will your experience of ministry at the Parramatta Corps equip you for what you will do in Ecuador?

My regular week has me focused on and involved with people from all over the world. I love the part of our mission statement that talks about all nations and all generations because that's my rich life experience in my role in our Corps. Because it's also 'all about Jesus', the potential of a mission trip is actually exciting (albeit - challenging!!)

What are you most excited about?

God's surprises as I take up the challenge of being out of my comfort zone - with a mission focused team - and understanding more about the international work of the Army.

What are you most nervous about?

Learning some Spanish - although I have great confidence in our language teacher. And praying for health and safety as we travel of course.

What are you praying that God will do through this journey to Ecuador?

To help facilitate the coming together of young people in a Christian environment - young people who wouldn't normally be able to afford to attend such an event. To know the mutual spiritual uplift and support that seems to accompany mission focused events. The gelling together of our team from Sydney with the leaders in Ecuador, the kids in camp and the local people supported in local ministries in Quito. Plenty to pray for.

What can we pray for as you prepare for this event?

That 'God will make a way' when the challenges of going to Ecuador seem a little overwhelming. Again - health, strength and safety.



NOVEMBER 2018 INTERNATIONAL MISSION EVENT "to the ends of the earth"

Last Sunday night a group of people from Parramatta and Ryde Corps met to learn what the International Mission Event to Ecuador involves and discuss how we can make it happen. The invitation to Ecuador has come from the Divisional Commander, Major Samuel Flores Morales who has the inspiration and the vision to begin Youth Camps in Quito, Ecuador. Ecuador does not have the benefit of the Red Shield Appeal to fund such a camp so they have sought our help to enable them to get something similar started in their own country. The plan is that a team of Australians will run this Youth Camp and at the same time train up the local youth and leaders to be able to lead future camps. Between our 'Collective' which consists of Auburn, Ryde, Merrylands and Parramatta we are aiming to send a team of apostles to Ecuador and also fund the delegates and leaders from Ecuador to attend the camp. The Salvation Army in Ecuador has a wonderful ministry amongst the youth and they want to enhance and develop this work, particularly with the disadvantaged in that country. Parramatta Corps were some of the first to support the Red Shield Camps when they began in Sydney and now we can take that missional motive and extend it 'beyond our walls'. There will also be opportunities for us to work within the other ministries and encourage the Salvationists in Cayambe and Quito corps'. There will be different ways you can support this mission. Our first step is gathering together those who are available to go to Ecuador. Stay tuned for more news and information!

This is a wonderful opportunity for us to 'share the love of Jesus' with take the gospel to the people who live at 'the ends of the earth'!

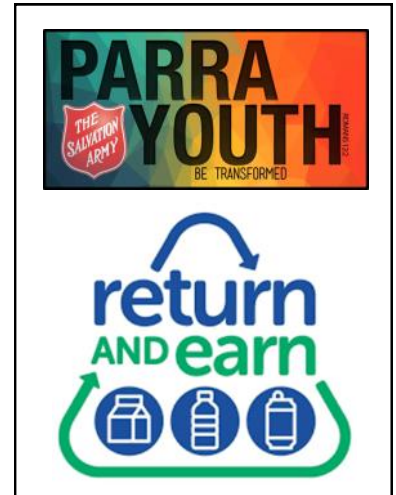
YOUTH GROUP EQUIP FUNDRAISER
