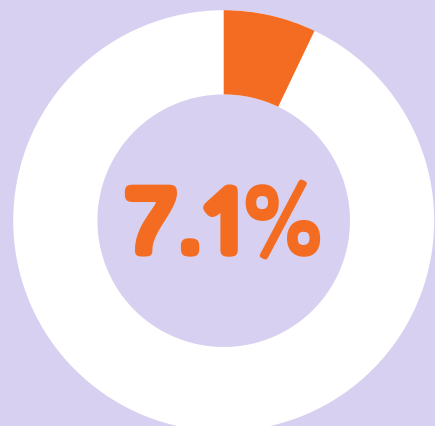

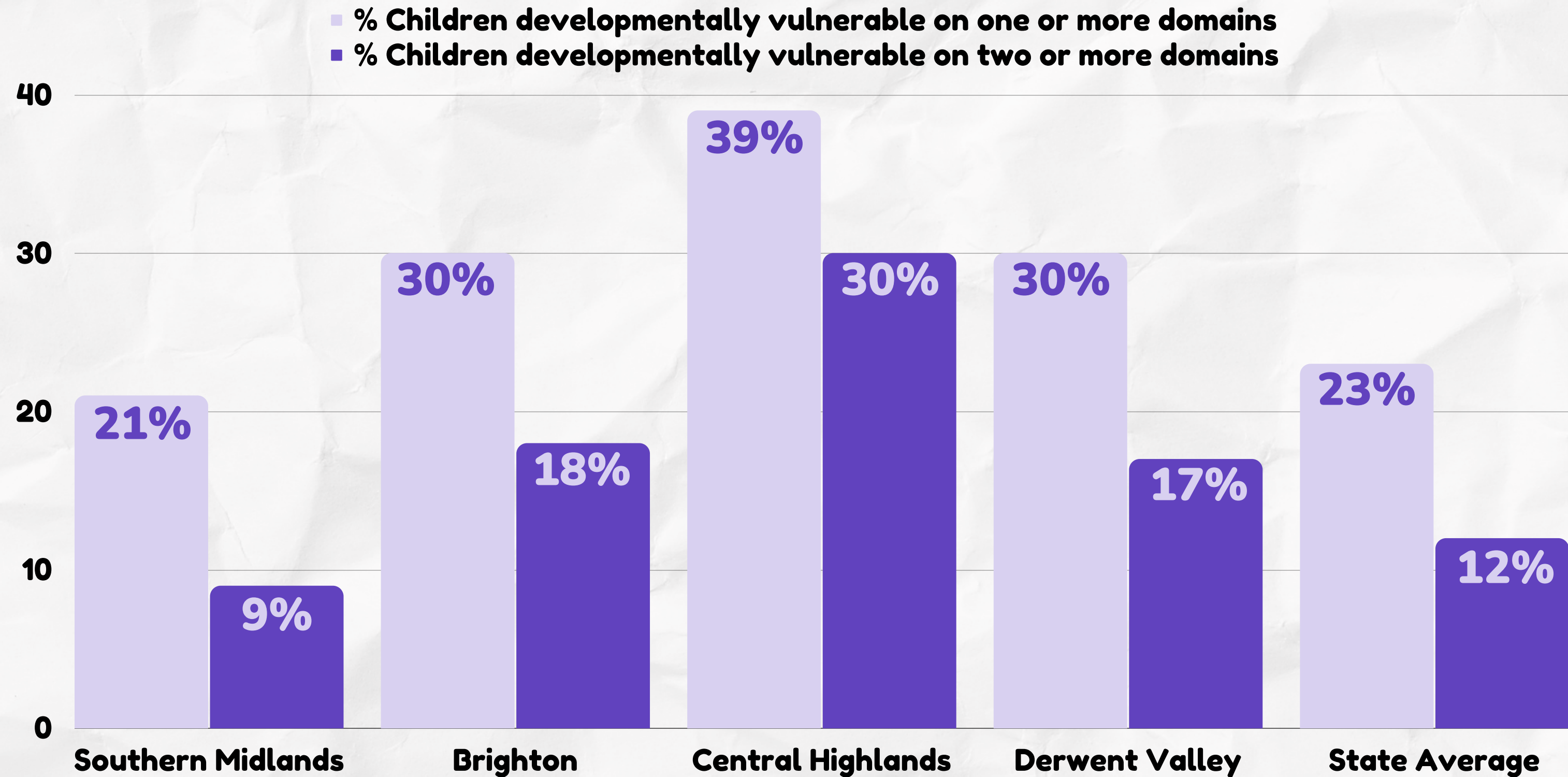

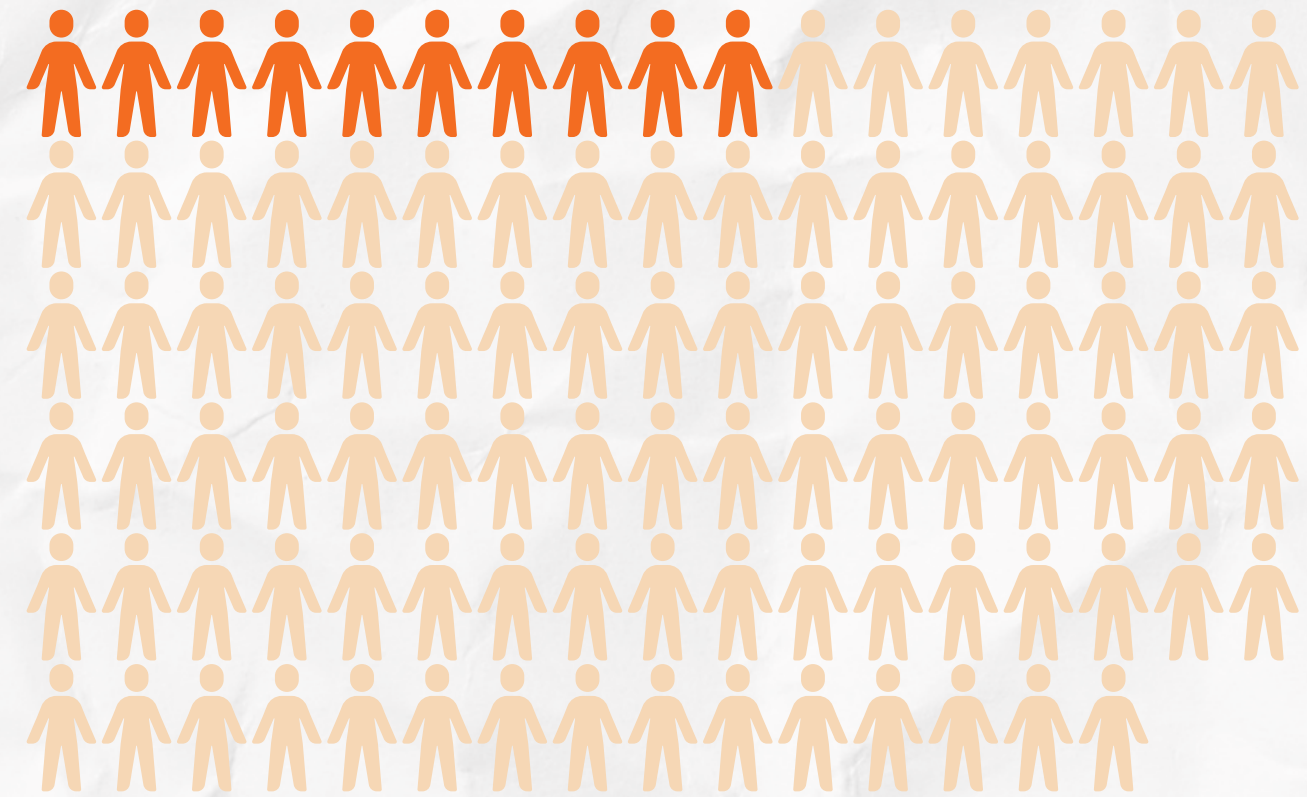


Combined Preschool and Primary School Enrollments

Preschool and Primary School Enrollments

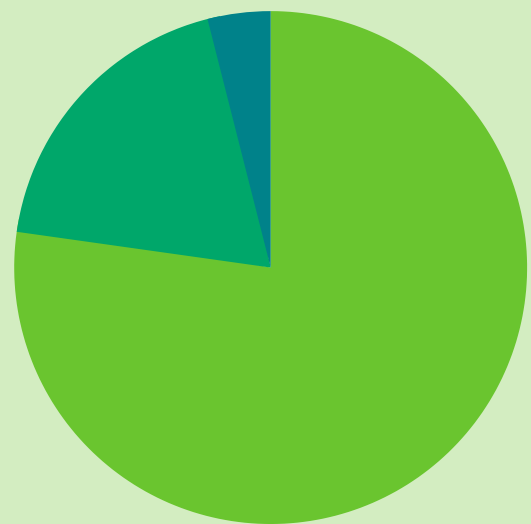

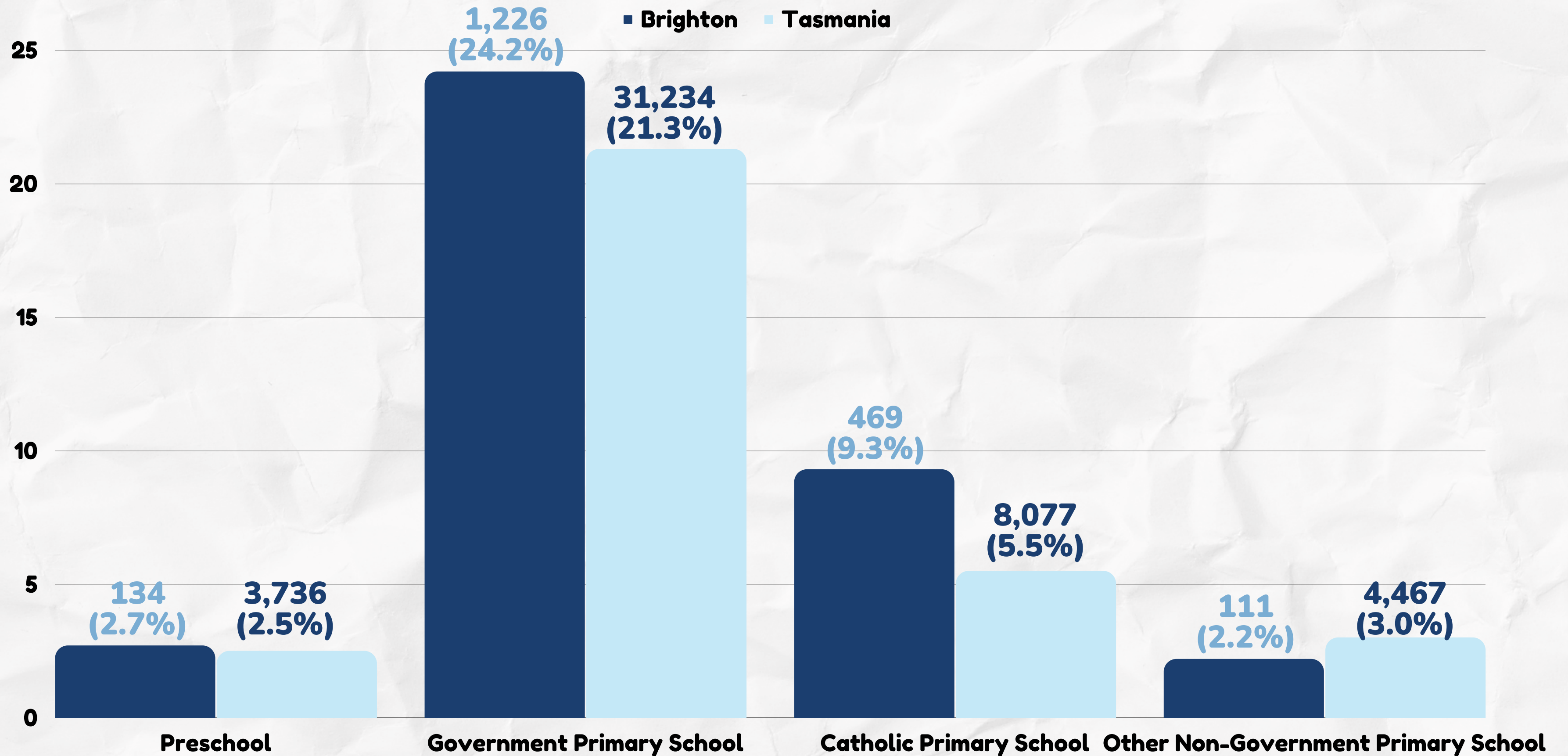
Primary School Enrollments

(as a % of the region's population)



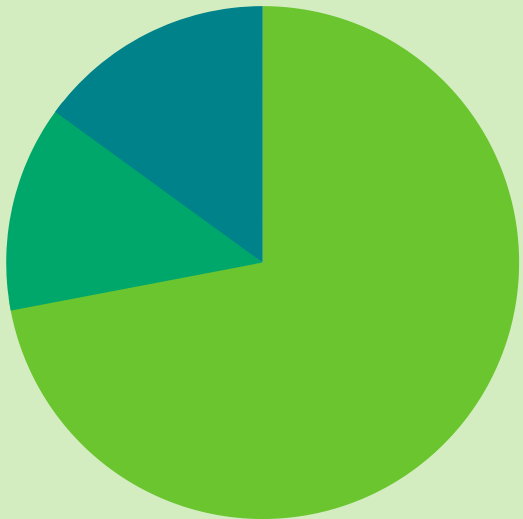
Preschool and Primary School Enrollments

(as a % of the region's whole population)



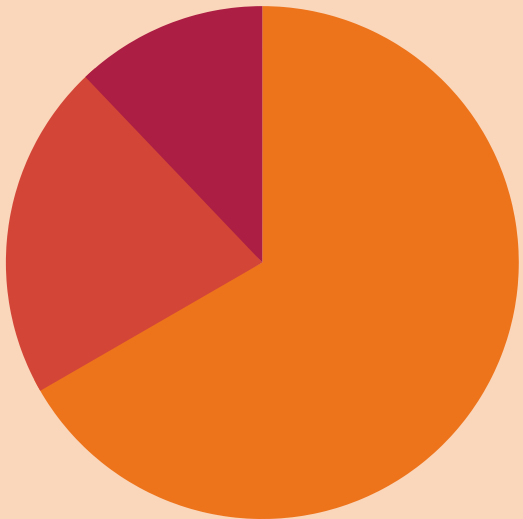

Preschool and Primary School Enrollments

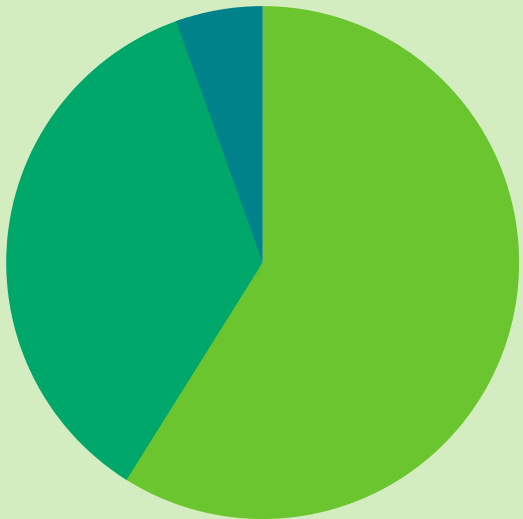

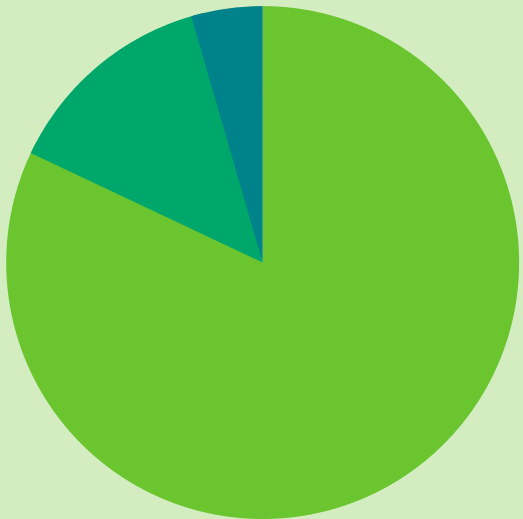
Preschool and Primary School Enrollments

(as a % of the region's whole population)



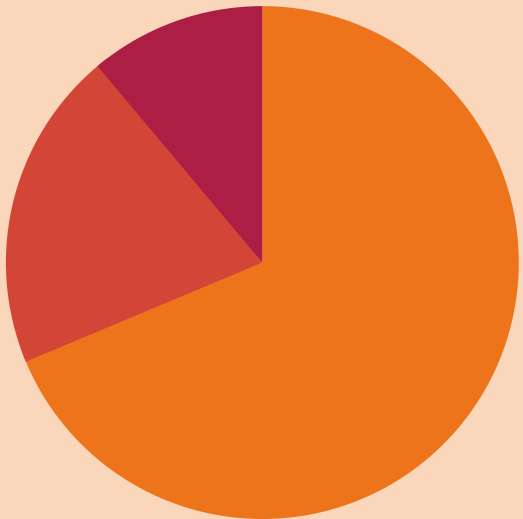
