HOLY WEEK / PASSION WEEK

What does Holy Week mean to you? In the Christian church, the week between Palm Sunday and Easter, observed with special solemnity as a time of devotion to the Passion of Jesus Christ. Passion Week is so named because of the passion with which Jesus willingly went to the cross in order to pay for the sins of His people. Passion Week is described in Matthew 21-27; Mark 11-15; Luke 19-23; and John 12-19. Passion Week begins with the triumphal entry on Palm Sunday on the back of a colt as prophesied in Zechariah 9:9.

Jesus did so much in the last week of his life on earth. So let us together go on a journey, as we are preparing our heart, mind and soul. We all know Jesus made his triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. This is a prophecy and fulfillment which is found in all four gospels.

However, what happens on the Monday, Jesus cursed the out of season fig tree for having no figs. This seems so unfair, but it is symbolic. In the OT figs represented the nation of Israel. Jesus was declaring that the nation had become spiritually dead. Read Matt 21 and Mark 11.

Now we wake up to Tuesday, Jesus was in Jerusalem, in a heated discussion with the religious leaders, teaching parables and healing the sick. Go and search the readings - the great supper, the good and wicked servants, the 10 virgins, the 2 sons, the owner of the vineyard, the wedding banquet and the 10 talents. These stories are all found in the gospels. To finish he spoke on Matthew 22:37 Love the Lord your God with all your heart, and Your Neighbour as yourself. He also did so much more.

Wednesday – maybe for some this day could be a highlight moment. Jesus was anointed by Mary in Bethany. What a special moment this was for Jesus because in 36 hours He would be on a cross. The disciples had no idea what was going on.

Take a moment now to imagine you are Mary and the look between you and Jesus as you are washing his feet with perfume and worshiping Him, king of King and lord of Lord's. Then Judas spoiled the moment.

Thursday – bring us to the Last Supper. They are now in the upper room. Take the time to read this account from all the gospels. Jesus knew the disciple who was about to be scared, unable to stay awake and 1 denied him 3 times.

At Eaglehawk corps during this special week, we are coming together for prayer and reflection. How will you be spending your time during Holy Week?

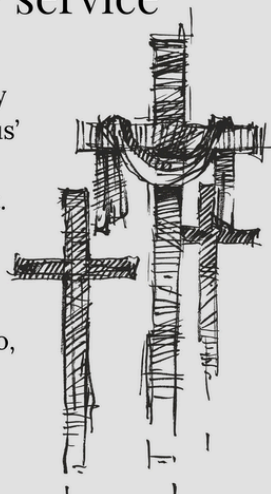
